

Beginning in January there have been more opportunities to journey alongside women. Two of the main ministries that I am currently involved in are leading Bible studies using "The Stranger on the Road to Emmaus" and co-leading a program called "Genesis Process."

'The Stranger on the Road to Emmaus' is put out by GoodSeed. It is a journey through the Bible from Creation to the Cross. It lays a solid foundation and then progressively introduces new truth based on previously understood truth. I am currently using this in our Healing Hearts ladies Bible Study as well as with two other family groups. One of the gals told me that the gospel is explained in such a way that she can understand it.

'Genesis Process' is a relapse prevention program that *recognizes that a person's behavior is the expression of their beliefs, so along with focusing on destructive behaviours, Genesis also concentrates on personal change.*" People use addictions and compulsive behaviors to help avoid unwanted thoughts, memories, and feelings. When one is traumatized, their heart makes decisions that help them to survive so they don't have to feel the pain. Many of the gals that I/we connect with have been traumatized in different ways, but the common denominator is that they had to somehow get relief from the pain—albeit only temporarily. Nobody sets out to say they want to become an addict or to live by compulsive behaviors. When they come to the point when they want to heal and they start to face the pain without avoiding it, it can be very difficult.

I am honored that these gals trust me with their wounded hearts and it is exciting to see what God is doing in the hearts and lives of these women. Seeing when understanding dawns on them, seeing them set free from strongholds and false beliefs, seeing them excited to share what God is doing in their lives.

Projects...

At the Healing Hearts Ministry Center there are many projects that need to be done and in the last month we have begun to work on them.

Paint the kitchen and dining room—In January, a team from Nipawin Bible College was here for a week and one of the things they did was to prep the kitchen and dining room for painting. That weekend a team from Millar College, which comes about one weekend a month to learn about and be involved in inner city ministry, helped to painted the rooms.

Sanctuary floor—A couple of years ago it was sanded but it was never finished. There has been talk about how it should be finished; a few weeks ago it was decided that we would paint it again with non-slip garage floor paint. The prep work took a lot of time as it needed to be leveled in a couple of places, there was sanding (that caused an incredible amount of dust), washing walls, etching areas of the cement then washing the floor and finally the painting. It is now completed!

Build a platform at the front of the sanctuary and make sound booth larger—this project is just getting started. This past weekend the Millar Team helped Wally demolish the current sound booth and now it is ready for building to begin. There will be a team coming from Philadelphia MB Church to help us with the building in mid-March. We are excited about having this project completed soon....update to come in the next letter.
